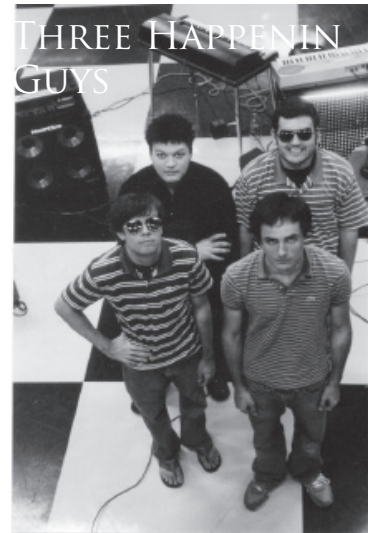

"Formed in October of 2000, The guys in Weak Music for Thomas have actually never written any weak music. Instead, you get punk without the prefab, metal without the meatheads, noise without the upturned nose, prog without the pretense. It's shapeshifting, intense and thoroughly spastic -- all the while retaining a keen sense of being a good, fun rock band. 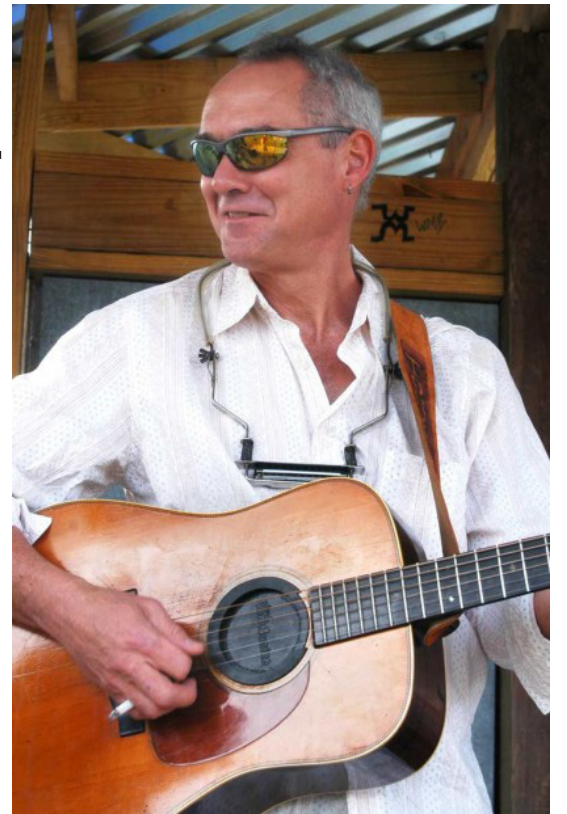

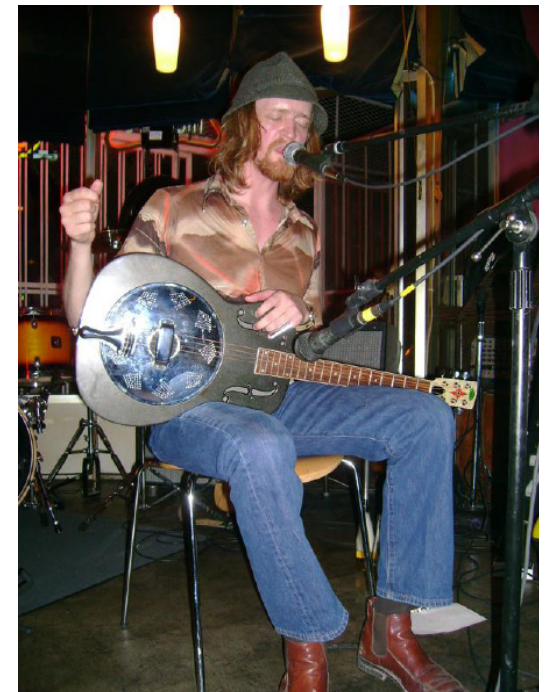

DID YOU KNOW?

* MORE THAN 15 % OF ALABAMA RESIDENTS LIVE IN POVERTY

* IN SOME ALABAMA COUNTIES, POVERTY AFFECTS ALMOST 30% OF THE POPULATION

* ONE OUT OF EVERY FIVE CHILDREN IN ALABAMA LIVES IN POVERTY

* ONE OUT OF EVERY FOUR ALABAMA SENIORS LIVES BELOW THE POVERTY LEVEL ALABAMA RANKS 12TH AMONG STATES IN THE U.S. FOR HUNGER RISK

* 13 % OF ALABAMA'S POPULATION FACES "FOOD INSECURITY", MEANING THESE INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES HAVE LIMITED OR UNCERTAIN ACCESS TO ENOUGH FOOD FOR A HEALTHY LIFE

* OVER 12% OF PEOPLE IN ALABAMA RECEIVE FOOD STAMPS EQUIVALENT TO 79 CENTS PER MEAL
